

32.4 KEY LANGUAGE "ENOUGH / TOO MUCH"

Use "enough," "not enough," and "too much" to talk about quantities of uncountable nouns.

We need eight ounces of flour. Do we have enough?



not enough flour



enough flour



too much flour

You need eight ounces of flour. Four is not enough.

Eight ounces is the correct amount: enough.

Twelve ounces is more than enough: too much.

There is **enough** flour.

There **isn't** enough flour.

There is **too much** flour.

They have **enough** flour.

They **don't** have enough flour.

They have **too much** flour.
